About the Author: Ayn Rand was a Russian-American novelist, philosopher, playwright, and screenwriter. She is known for her two best-selling novels and for developing a philosophical system she called Objectivism. Born and educated in Russia, Rand immigrated to the United States in 1926. After coming to this country, she came by work as a screenwriter in Hollywood and had *Night of January 16th* initially produced on the stage in 1934. Her first novel, We the Living, was published in 1936 as a semi-autobiographical piece of fiction. Rand eventually achieved worldwide success with her book *The Fountainhead*. This was followed by her best-known work, the philosophical novel *Atlas Shrugged*. She has also had an influence on a number of notable people in fields such as psychology, economics, and political science. Since Rand's death in 1982, there has been gradually increasing interest in her work. Her books have been international best sellers, and continue to sell in large numbers in the 21st century.
